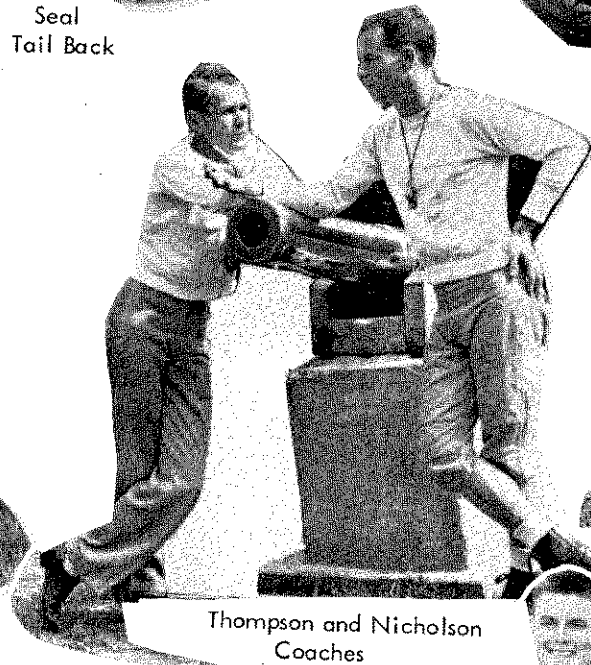
CHA Wins Over Fayette
