Our character, our actions and our accomplishments are determined by the high or low placement of educational aims.



FOOTBALL ROUND UP

The opening game of the 1961 season saw the Wildcats lose to Hazlehurst by a 27-7 score. Although outclassed by the powerful Hazlehurst team the Cadets fought gamely throughout the contest. The following Friday night the cadets entertained outof-state Waterproof, La. This game was a case of both teams having, more defense than their opponents offense, and ended in a 0-0 tie.

On September 22, CHA met its first Tangipahoa Conference opponent as a member of the Conference. It so happened that its opponent, Liberty, proved to be the eventual Conference Champion. The game was a nightmare for the Cadets as they apparently could do nothing right, and Liberty could do nothing wrong. The final score was Liberty 51-CHA 14.

The following week the Cadets hit the win column for the first time as they racked up Wesson 14-0. On October 6 the Cadets were again victorious as they dropped Woodville 13-7.

Meadville was the next opponent of the Wildcats and a real scrap ensued. Meadville was the eventual winner by a 19-12 count.


The following week was Homecoming for CHA and saw them tangling with the Magnolia proved too much for the Cadets and romped to a 32-7 win. This game saw the longest scoring play of the season for CHA as Darden Davis took a Bearcat kickoff and raced 90 yards for a TD.

The final game of the season was also the hardest defeat as the Cadets dropped a 7-0 decision to arch rival Port Gibson.







WILCAT REVENGE ON PORT GIBSON


Tuesday night the Wildcat basketball team avenged their earlier season defeat at the hands of Port Gibson by downing the Blue Wave 57-49. The game was a thriller throughout with the Wave building a ten point lead midway the second quarter. CHA pulled within one point with just a few minutes. remaining in the half but Port Gibson came back with two field goals to lead at halftime 28-23. The second half was a see-saw battle with CHA slowly closing the gap, finally tying the count mid-way the fourth quarter. The game was tied five times in the fourth quarter with CHA going: ahead to stay with two minutes of game time remaining. In the final two minutes with Port Gibson desprately trying to close the gap CHA pulled away for the final 57-49 score. Doug Smira was high point man for the game as he sacked 27 points for the Cadets.

The CHA B team repeated their earlier season win as they topped the Blue Wave 46-22. CHA led 14-8 at halftime and they scored a blistering 19 points in the third quarter to ice the game. Coach Box cleared his bench in the final quarter but the Wildcats had their steam up and continued to pull away.

Last week the Wildcats tied for third place in the Tangipahoa Conference Tournament held in Gloster. The Cadets won over Meadville and Fayette but fell before the powerful Magnolia five in the semi-finals. Doug Smira was selected on the All-Conference team during the tournament.





Riley Nelson lowered the existing 220 yard dash record of 22.7 to 22.4. The Cadet mile relay also broke the mile relay record of 3:35.2 as they ripped off a new record time of 3:35.1.

The 1961 edition of the CHA track team was by far the most successful in the history of the Academy. They won meets at the Port Gibson Invitation, District Seven, South Mississippi and State. They were second in the Jackson Daily News Relays behind Pearl who eventually won the State A-AA boys division. They have set new records in the District, South Mississippi and State meets.
