FOOTBALL ROUND UP

The opening game of the 1961 season saw the Wildcats lose to Hazlehurst by a 27-7 score. Although outclassed by the powerful Hazlehurst team the Cadets fought gamely throughout the contest. The following Friday night the cadets entertained out-of-state Waterproof, La. This game was a case of both teams having, more defense than their opponents offense, and ended in a 0-0 tie.

On September 22, CHA met its first Tangipahoa Conference opponent as a member of the Conference. It so happened that its opponent, Liberty, proved to be the eventual Conference Champion. The game was a nightmare for the Cadets as they apparently could do nothing right, and Liberty could do nothing wrong. The final score was Liberty 51-CHA 14.

The following week the Cadets hit the win column for the first time as they racked up Wesson 14-0. On October 6 the Cadets were again victorious as they dropped Woodville 13-7.

Meadville was the next opponent of the Wildcats and a real scrap ensued. Meadville was the eventual winner by a 19-12 count.

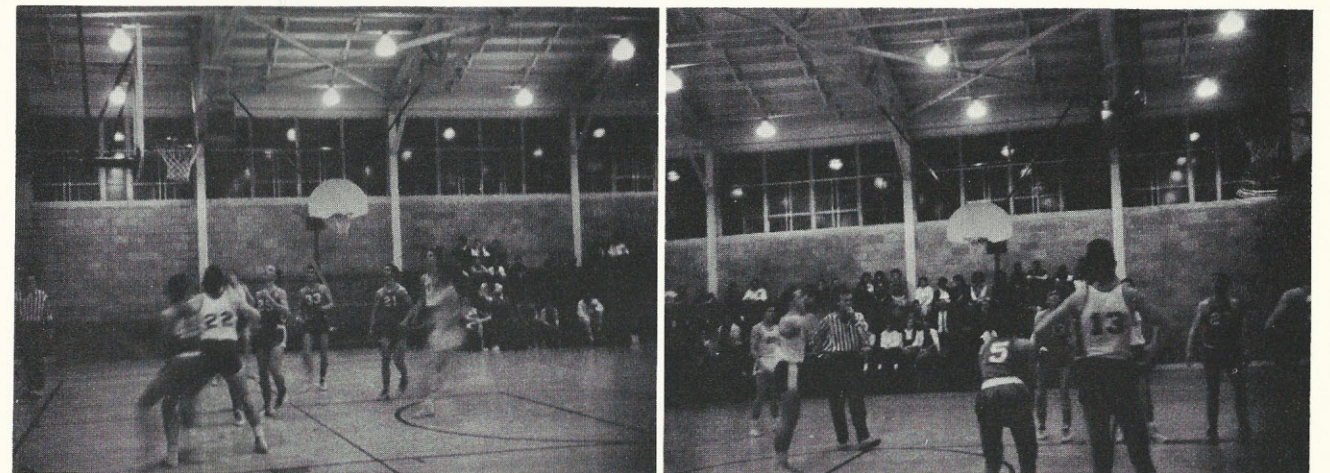

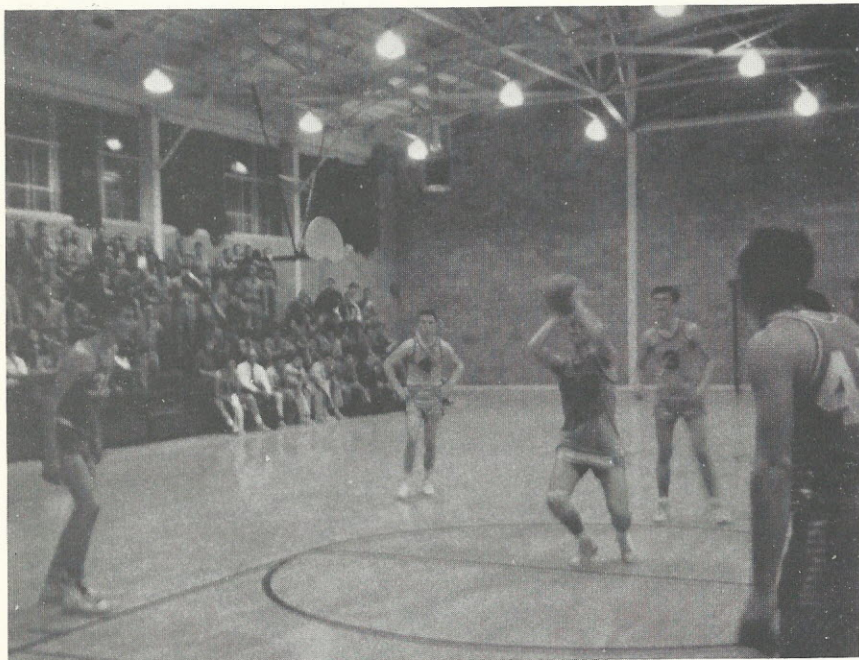
WILCAT REVENGE ON PORT GIBSON
