At the intermission, Mrs. Davis and Mrs. Newman presided over the serving of the punch to the Cadet Corps and their parents.


The Cadet's parents and their guests were seated on the dance floor where they could watch the dance, and visit among themselves and the Faculty members.

The colors for the dance were red, white, and blue. The Table areas were covered by crepe canopies, and the dance floor walled by streamers of crepe paper.


