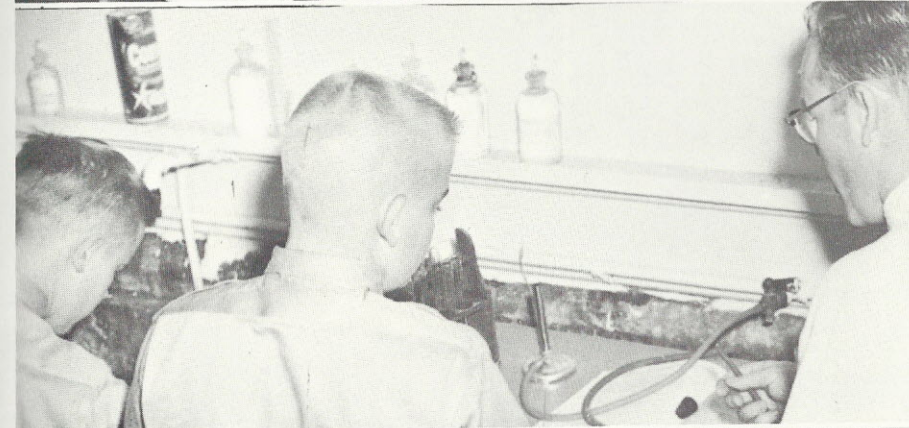
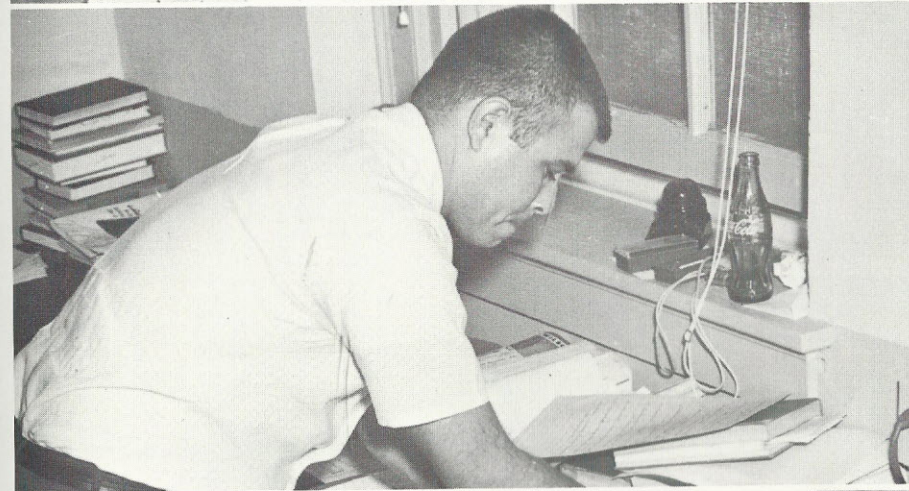
At the intermission, Mrs. Davis and Mrs. Newman presided over the serving of the punch to the Cadet Corps and their parents.
