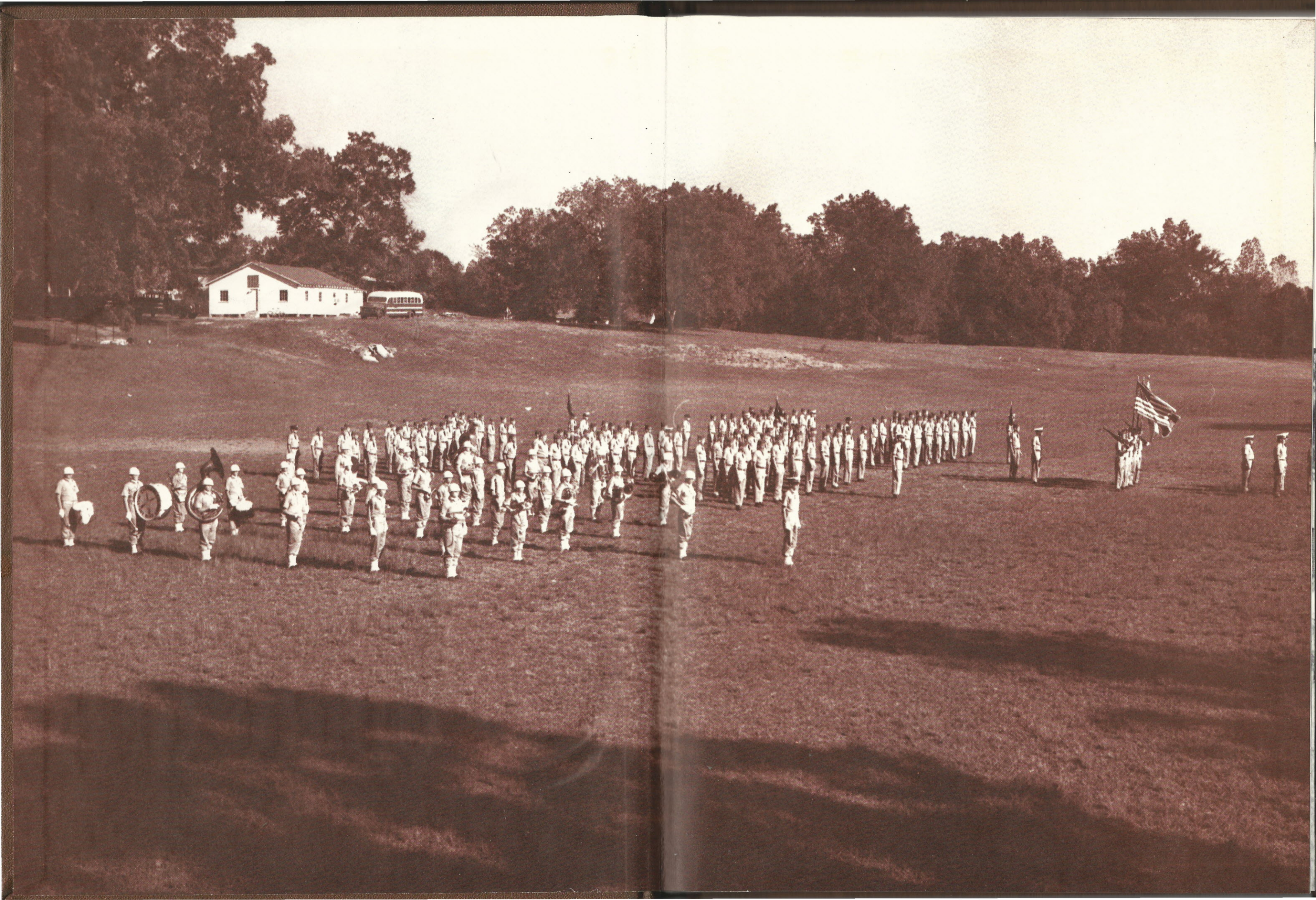



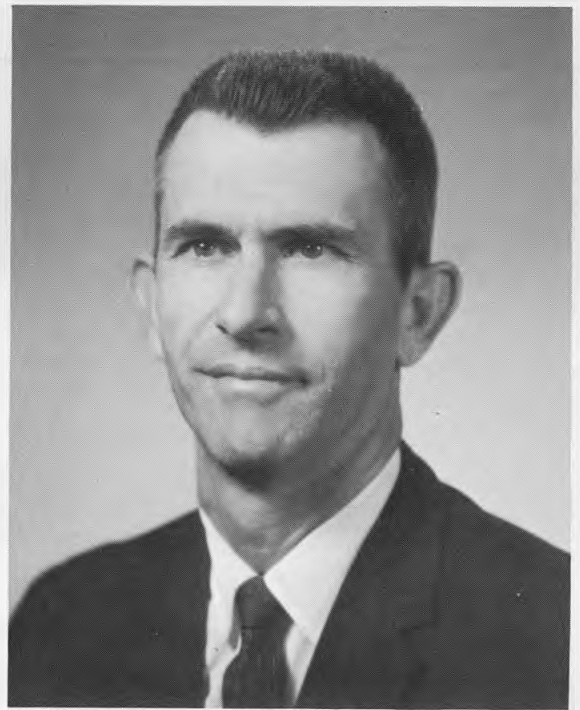

If I Had A Son

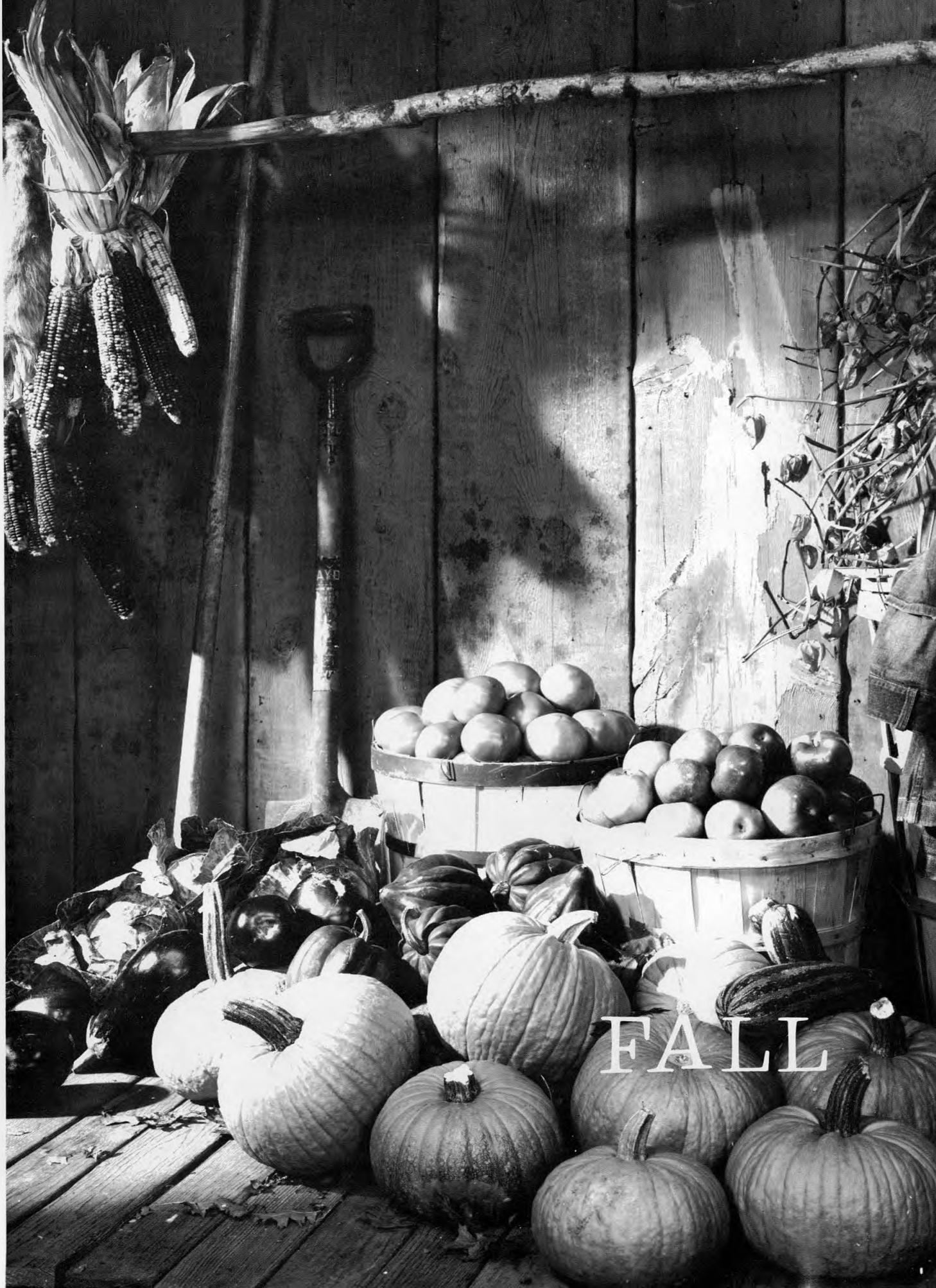
If I had a son...
