
DEDICATION

TRACK 1968





The 1968 Wildcat track team enjoyed their finest season since the State Champions of 1965. A warning of things to come were served by the Cadets as they opened the season in a four-way meet on the Port Gibson track, sweeping by Port Gibson, Jefferson County and Natchez Cathedral by a large margin. The Port Gibson Lions Relays furnished the next test and found the Wildcats finishing in a tie with Warren Central for the team championship. In rapid succession followed the Belzoni Invitational where the Cadets proved their mettle on a state-wide basis as they captured the Class A trophy, a four-way meet at Crystal Springs saw the Cadets lose to Tylertown, their eventual conqueror in District and South Mississippi meets, and then their finest hour, a victory at the Jackson Daily News Relays. This victory showed the spirit of this team, as they failed to capture a first place relay win, but extra effort throughout all the events gave enough second, third, fourth and fifth places to earn the large team trophy.

The following District and South meets saw the Cadets chasing a fine Tylertown team, only to fall inches and points short in each meet.

After the completion of the South Mississippi meet, a survey showed CHA and Tylertown qualifying in five events each. Hopes soared that this team might still bring yet another State Championship to "the Hill", but fate ruled otherwise. A sharp object on the floor of a dormitory proved too much for this team to overcome. A key relay man, checking the dorm after taps, stepped on the object, cut the ball of his foot and dreams of a State championship were severed with the injury.

However, the Corps can do no less that give a hearty "well done" to this group. They are not State champions by points, but in heart and effort they are tops.




