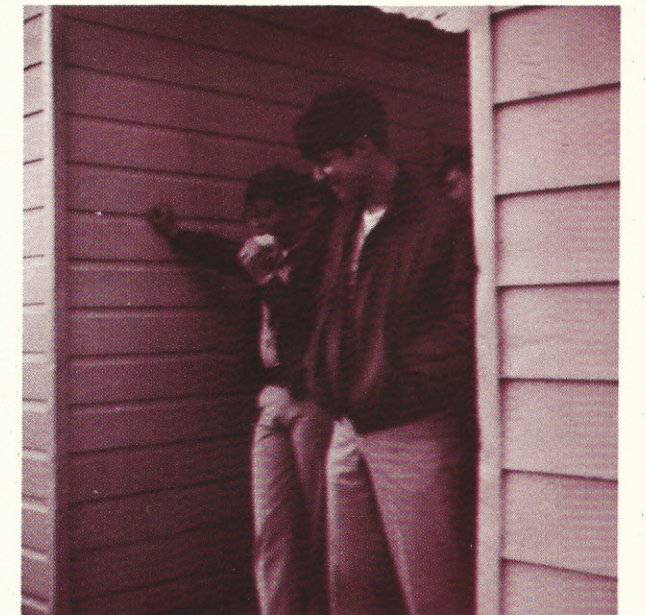
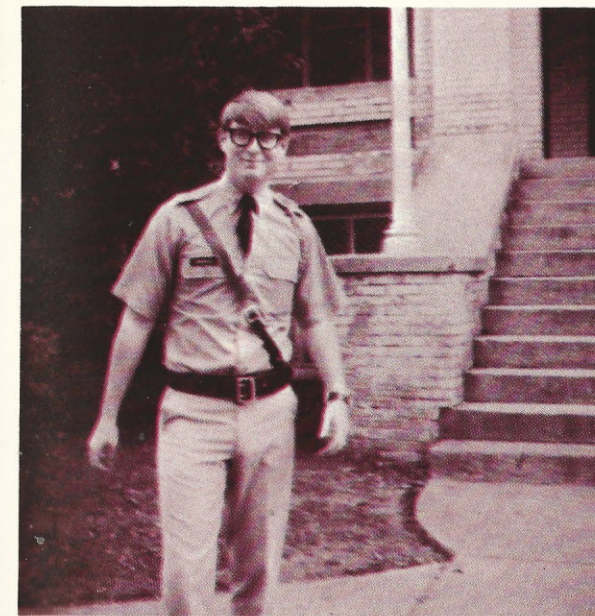

We have, therefore, rewrapped some of these gifts

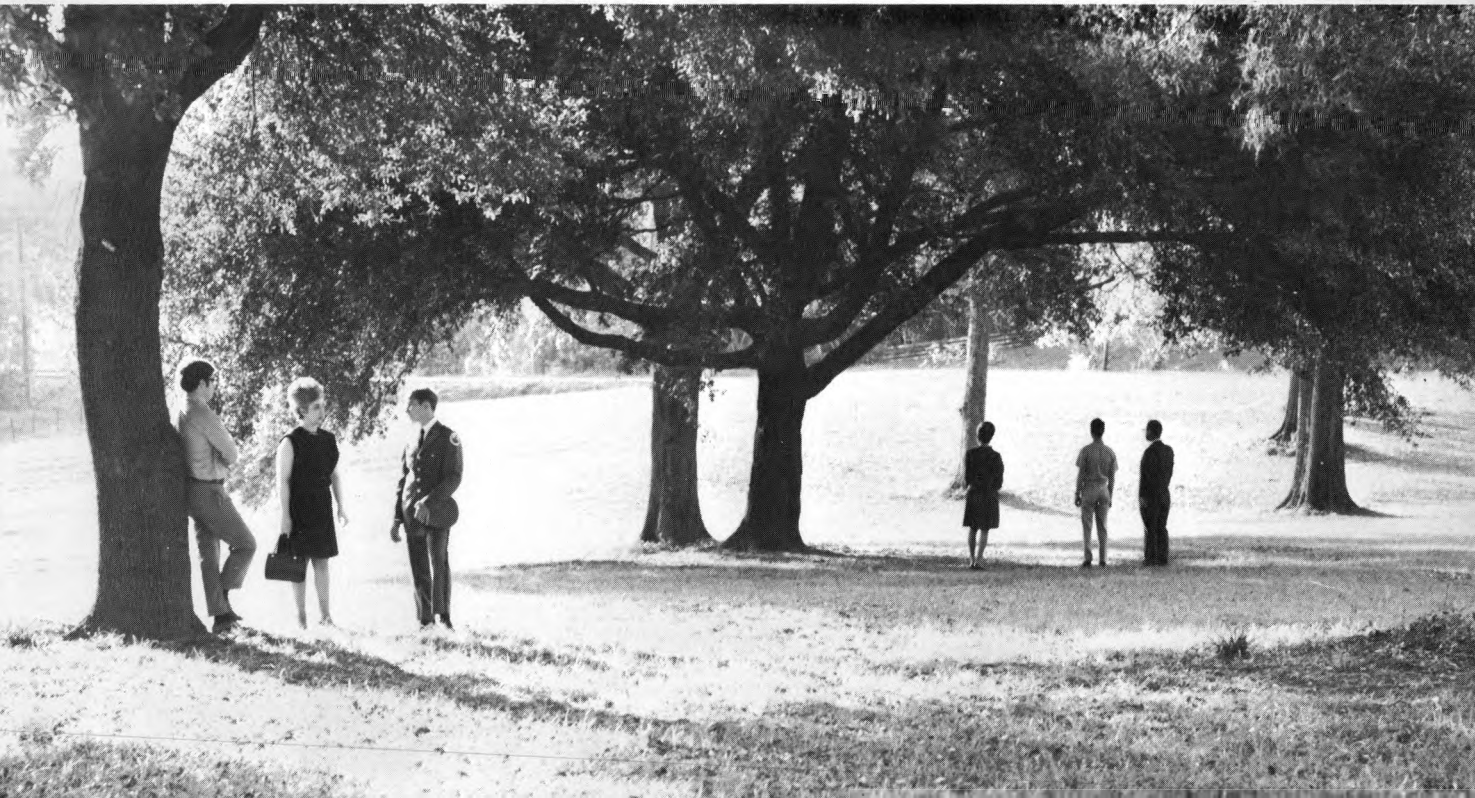

New CHA Building
Officially Named

The Board of Trustees of Chamberlain-Hunt Academy voted March 9, 1971 to make the official name of the new classroom structure "The Science Building."

The committee recommended that it be inscribed with a bronze plaque in memory of the late Robert D. Gage, Jr., Chairman of the Board from 1957 until his death in August 1970.

A tour of buildings on campus will include Redus Hall, dormitory; McComb Building, administration, auditorium, library, study hall, and classrooms; Guthrie, dormitory; Gage Hall, dormitory and dining hall; Commandant's home; the Kennedy Gymnasium, and the Jenkins Infirmary.
