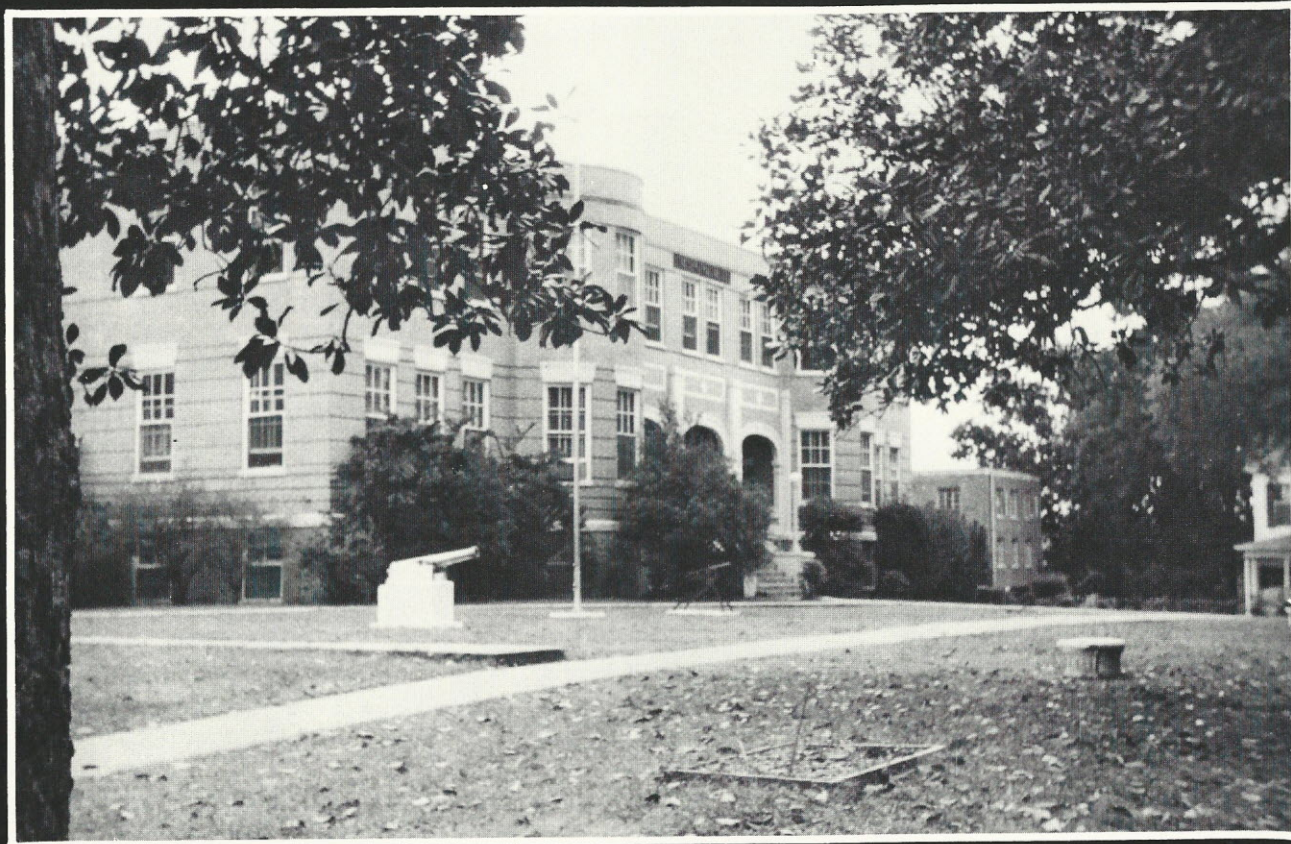




THE UNITY OF LEARNING

He was a man of humility and fairness, yet his strong principles were incorporated into the history of this institution, Chamberlain-Hunt Academy.

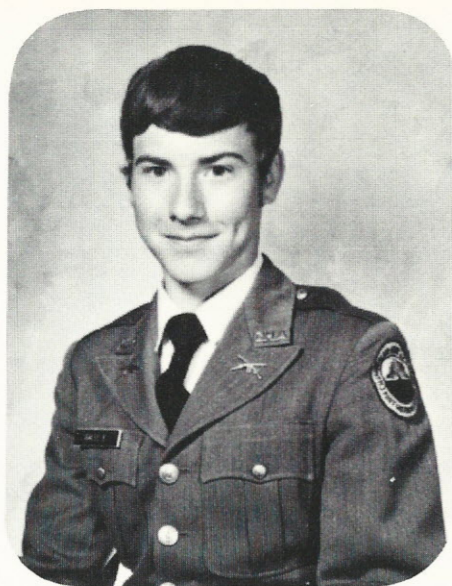

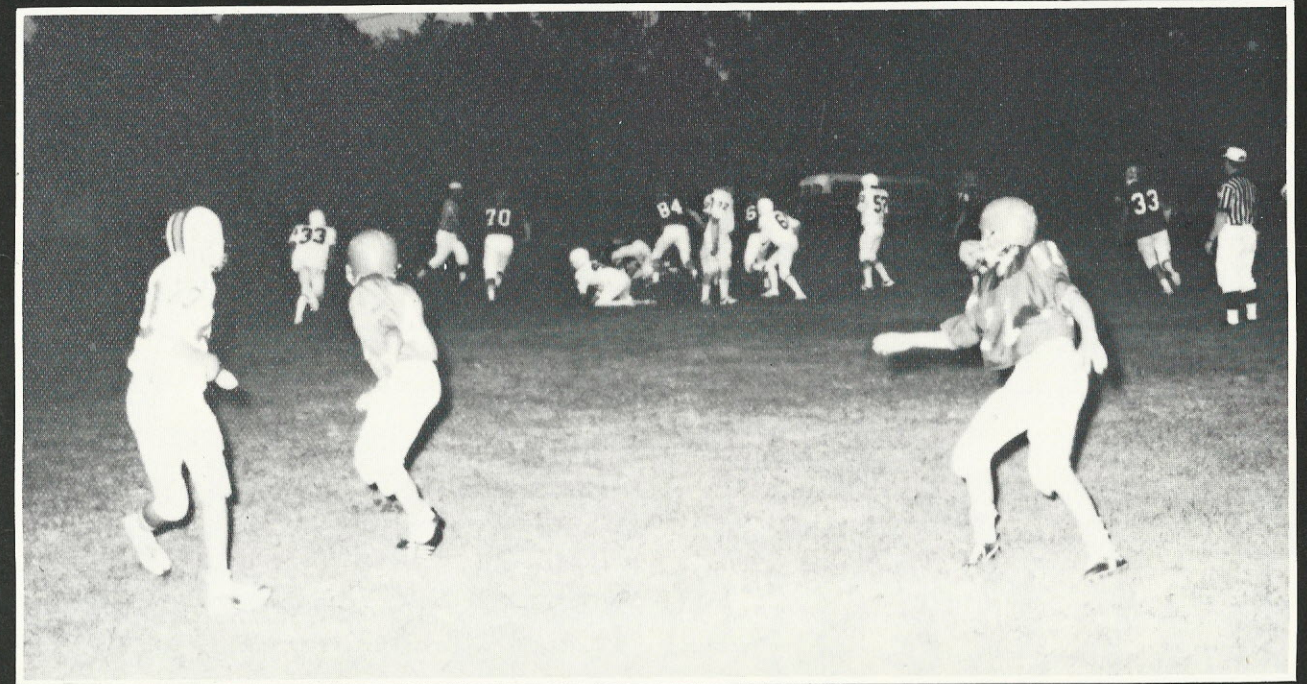

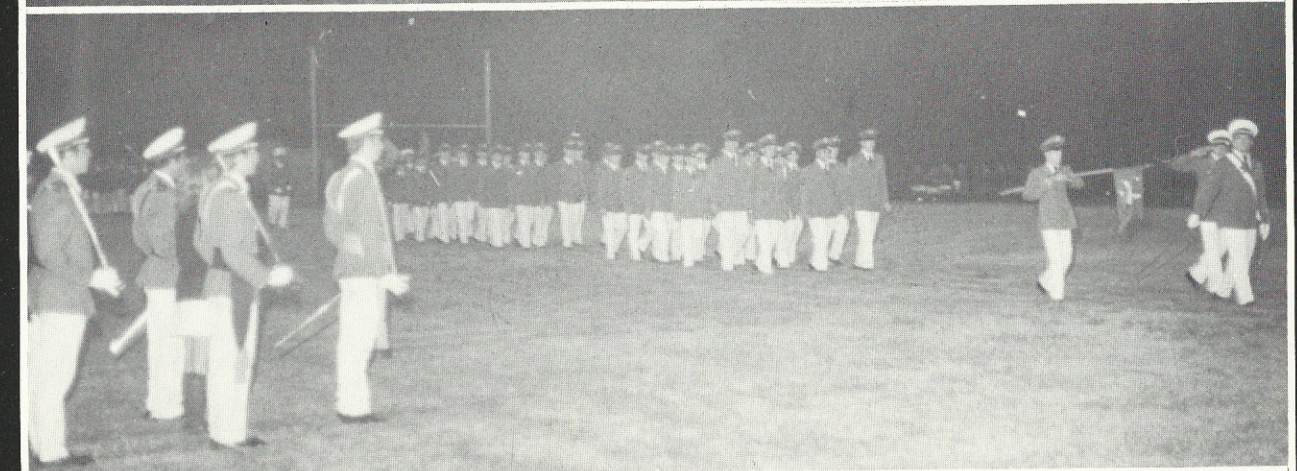
