ADMINISTRATION

FACILITIES

The Academy can accommodate approximately two hundred boarding students and one hundred day students. McComb Hall houses classrooms, administrative offices. library, containing over 5000 volumns, and a chapel-auditorium. The Science Building houses all the science classrooms and laboritories. This boasts the most up-to-date teaching equipment available. Guthrie Hall houses three staff members and seventy-five boys. This dormitory was one of the original buildings built on the present site in 1901. Extensive renovation was done to this building in 1958. Redus Hall, constructed in 1925, houses two faculty families and thirty-six boys. Gage Hall, erected in 1948, has quarters for three staff members and fifty-five boys. The girls are housed in a new home across from the school next to the President's home. A faculty family and approximately twenty girls can be accommodated here. Kennedy Gymnasium affords facilities for basketball, volleyball, gymnastics, ping-pong, and

billiards. It also provides a recreation area with soda fountain, canteen and dressing rooms. The lobby of the gym serves as a visitation lounge for off-campus visitors. Jenkins infirmary provides ample medical facilities for the Academy. including resident nurse's quarters, examination room, isolation rooms and general ward.

The Campus proper contains approximately twenty acres, but the entire Academy property amounts to one hundred and sixty-seven acres. This acreage is mostly woodland and contains one small lake.




ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Instructors are carefully chosen for their work with young people. Chamberlain-Hunt is a member of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, the Mid-South Association of Independent Schools and the Mississippi Association of Private Schools. Small classes. individualized instruction. and a close check on the progress of each student characterize the academic program.


STAFF

The Academy administrative staff includes the President, Principal, Admissions Officer, Public Relations Director, Commandant, Chaplain, Bookkeeper, Dietitian, Nurse and adequate clerical assistance. The teaching staff includes a fulltime librarian, a developmental reading specialist and eighteen instructors. There are numerous staff members with advanced degrees and most boast graduate work. The faculty holds degrees from the University of Mississippi, University of Southern Mississippi, Mississippi State University, Mississippi State College for Women, Mississippi College, Delta State College, Louisiana State University, Emory University, Millsaps College and Murray State University. The coaches of various athletic teams are drawn from the faculty as are all the directors of extracurricular activities. Nearly half of the staff live on campus and take their meals in the dining hall.





LIONS' CLUB RELAYS 1976-1977




SENIORS RETIRING THEIR FLAG
