Religious Emphasis Week

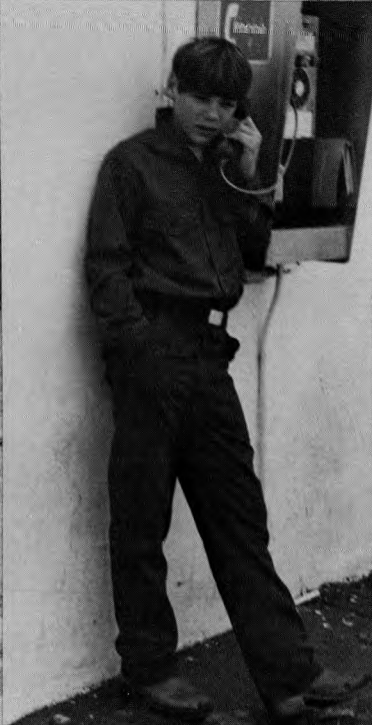
RELIGIOUS EMPHASIS
