

A Century To Celebrate



1879 History 1979

Chamberlain-Hunt Academy, chartered in 1877, has been in continuous operation since 1879 at Port Gibson, Mississippi. Owned and operated by the Presbyterian Church, Synod of the Mid-South, it is one of the oldest educational institutions controlled by that body. It is the successor to Oakland College, founded in 1830 but discontinued in 1871. The Name honors Dr. Jeremiah Chamberlain, first president of Oakland College, and Mr.

David Hunt, its generous benefactor. Chamberlain-Hunt has, since its inception, endeavored to be, as called for in its charter, ''an institution of liberal Christian learning.'' It is to date a college preparatory school for boys and girls. The energies of its staff are dedicated to molding good character in young people during the formative years of their lives. Military training is required of all cadets. Besides learning self-discipline and developing leadership, a cadet


learns to accept responsibility, to take and give orders, to practice cleanliness, punctuality, and courtesy.






THE LIGHT OF EDUCATION
