The architectual plans worked out by the CHA Board, the faculty, Mr. J.J. McComb, (CHA Alumnus, former Claiborne County resident) and Mr. McComb's New York architect, provided one of the most interesting Queen Anne structures in the State of Miss.

It was basically symmetrical, but was very picturesque because it had a turrett and a clock tower of different heights prominent on the front. The high roof was covered with dormers and tall chimneys.

The architectural plan for the new location of CHA at Woodstock on the southern limits of Port Gibson began to be realized with the building of McComb Building in 1900, named in honor of J.J. McComb for his generous gift towards its erection, and Guthrie Hall in 1901, named in honor of Professor W.C. Guthrie, President of CHA. The frame house for the president to the southwest of Guthrie was built in 1902.

When it became necessary to build another dormitory, Gage Hall was constructed south of Guthrie in 1948 and named in honor of Judge R.D. Gage, Chairman of the Board from 1924-1950.







An Academy

With the fire of 1924, on a very cold night in January, upon renovation, many of the architectural details of McComb Building were omitted.

At the time McComb Building was renovated, Redus Hall just to the north, was built that in 1926, McComb Building was located in the heart of the campus, with Redus to the north and Guthrie to the south, and functioned as the heart of the school.

Though future buildings extended to the southeast, there is still the "concept" that McComb Building is the heart of the school because it contains the library, the Senior High classrooms, the auditorium – chapel, and the Administration offices, and is the "heart of the campus."







Our Campus

When in 1971, the Board affirmed that any qualified student would be admitted to the Academy, the faculty residence on McComb Ave, east of the campus was converted into a "makeshift" dormitory for girls. When that became full, the Board authorized the construction of a girls dormitory which when completed in 1975 was named Kathleen McKenzie Dormitory. It is located north of the President's Home.

A Science Building was constructed east of Jenkins Infirmary in 1972 and dedicated to the memory of R.D. Gage, Jr., Chairman of the Board from 1957-1970. This building today is used also for Junior High Classes.

The Bolling Dining Hall, located east of Science Bldg., was completed in 1976 and named for the Rev. Richard A. Bolling, a 1905 Graduate of CHA and a valued member of the Board for many years.



We Build



A brick colonial home for the president was erected across from McComb Avenue north of the front campus in 1971.

A gymnasium and recreation building was constructed east of Gage Hall in 1956 and named in honor and memory of Col. J.W. Kennedy, President from 1921-42.

In 1964, an infirmary was built on the east side of Kennedy Gym and named for Dr. W.N. Jenkins, a long-time school physician and member of the Board. A plaque in the infirmary expresses appreciation to the Women of the Church of Ms. for their donations of energy and funds towards financing this building.










The CHA Band, directed by Mr. Jimmy Rigdon, attended the MS Private School Association Band Festival at Delta State University on April 2nd.
