The architectural plans worked out by the CHA Board, the faculty. Mr. J.J. McComb, (CHA Alumnus, former Claiborne County resident) and Mr. McComb's New York architect, provided one of the most interesting Queen Anne structures in the State of Miss.
It was basically symmetrical, but was very picturesque because it had a turrett and a clock tower of different heights prominent on the front. The high roof was covered with dormers and tall chimneys.

The architectural plan for the new location of CHA at Woodstock on the southern limits of Port Gibson began to be realized with the building of McComb Building in 1900, named in honor of J.J. McComb for his generous gift towards its erection, and Guthrie Hall in 1901, named in honor of Professor W.C. Guthrie. President of CHA The frame house for the president to the southwest of Guthrie was built in 1902.

## History 1879-1981

Chamberlain-Hunt Academy, chartered in 1877. has been in continuous operation since 1879 at Port Gibson. Mississippi. Owned and operated by the Presbyterian Church. Synod of the Mid-South, it is one of the oldest educational institutions controlled by that body. It is the successor to Oakland College, founded in 1830 but discontinued to 1871. The Name honors Dr. Jeremiah Chamberlain, first president of Oakland College, and Mr. David Hunt, its generous benefactor.
Chamberlain-Hunt has, since its inception, endeavored to be, as called for in its charter. "an institution of liberal Christian learning." It is to date a college preparatory school for boys and girls. The energies of its staff are dedicated to molding good character in young people during the formative years of their lives.

Military training is required of all cadets. Besides learning self-discipline and developing leadership, a cadet learns to accept responsibility, to take and give orders, to practice cleanliness, punctuality, and courtesy.

Every cadet is a God-created individual and it is the concern of the staff that "he grow in wisdom and in stature, and in favor with God and man."
