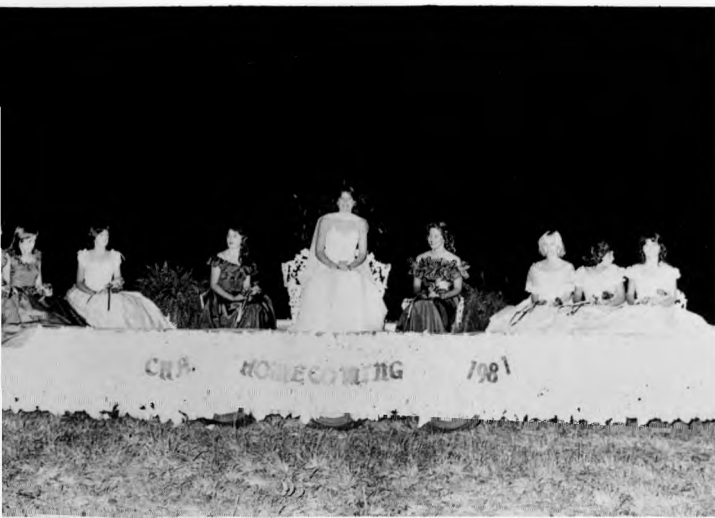

History

Chamberlain-Hunt Academy, chartered in 1877, has been in continuous operation since 1879 at Port Gibson, Mississippi. Owned and operated by the Presbyterian Church, Synod of the Mid-South, it is one of the oldest educational institutions controlled by that body. It is the successor to Oakland College, founded in 1830 but discontinued to 1871. The name honors Dr. Jeremiah Chamberlain, first president of Oakland College, and Mr. David Hunt, its generous benefactor.

New President Named For CHA

A 52-year-old retired Air Force officer who earned a doctor of education degree after he left the service has been named president of Chamberlain-Hunt Academy. He is Dr. Charles R. Bryant of Thomasville, Georgia.

Dr. Bryant served as president of the Thomas County Community College of Thomasville from 1977-1981.

Dr. Bryant is a graduate of Auburn University in Alabama, having earned B.S., M.S., and Ed.D. degrees there, with emphasis on curriculum development and educational facility planning for his doctorate.

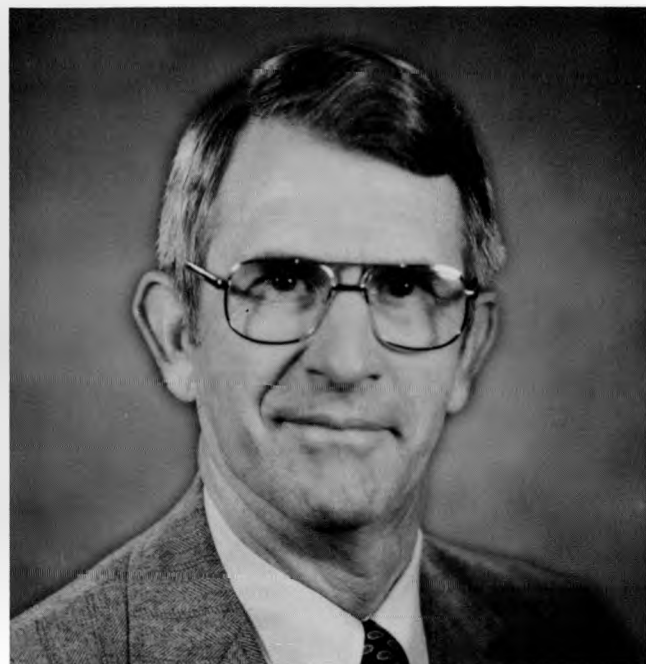
Dr. Bryant's military career gave him widely varied experience as a pilot, commander, staff officer, and operations officer. He has flown 57 different types of military aircraft and logged 12,000 miles flying.

The new president is married to the former Mary Earle Eidson, born in Enterprise, Ala., and they have three adult children, two sons and a daughter. Dr. Bryant himself graduated from Foley High School, Foley, Ala.

Dr. Bryant is a member of the Presbyterian Church, and has served as a deacon and an elder. He has also been a member of various civic organizations.

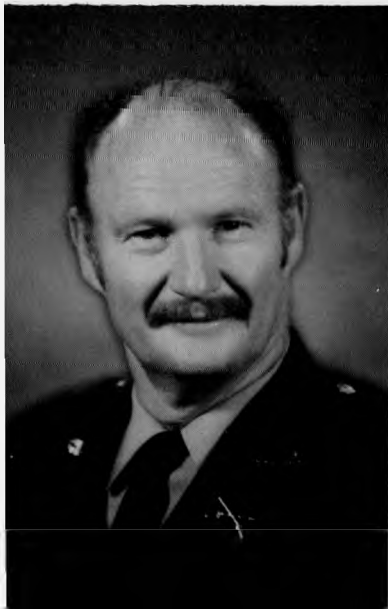




Military Department

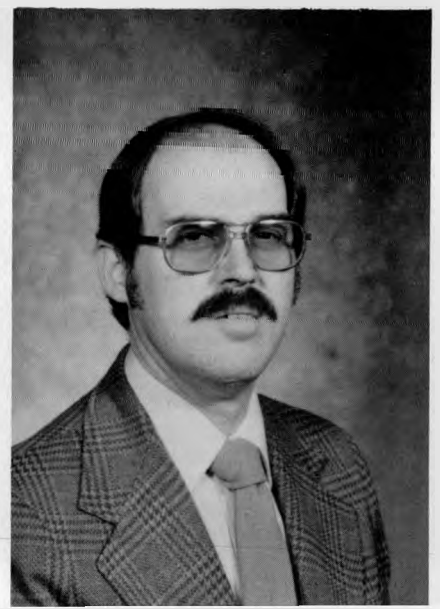

The Lady Wildcats began their outstanding season by winning the Brandon Academy Invitational. They also won the Sharkey-Issaquena Tournament, the Copiah Tournament, and the Rebul Invitational. The Lady 'Cats ended their regular season with a 30-1 record overall and 7-1 in conference play, which placed them first in the South AA Conference. Their only loss was to Parklane, but they came back to beat them on Parklane's home court. They defeated Copiah in the semifinals of the Conference Tournament and Columbia Academy in the finals to win the championship. 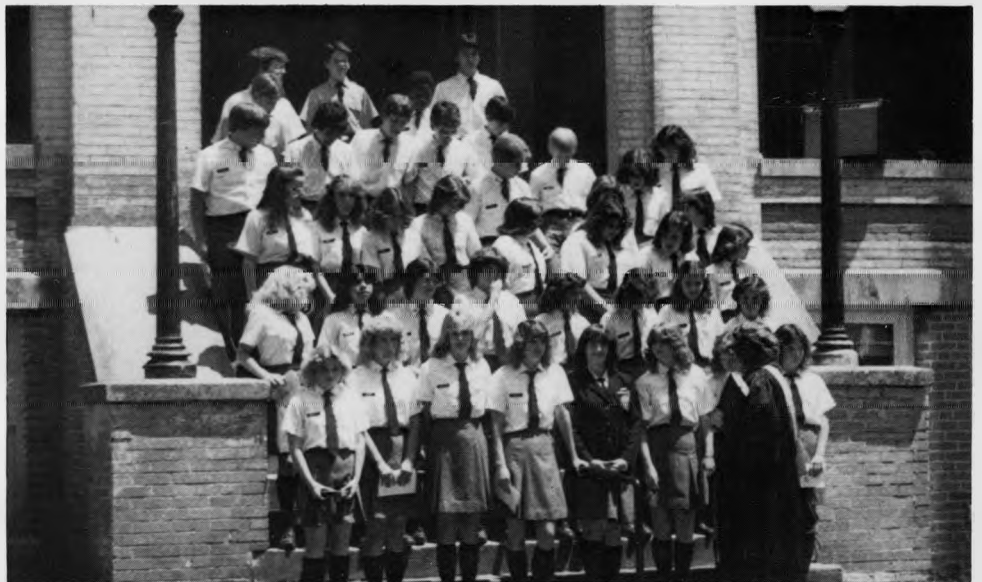
