



Captain






#### ALBERT MOORE, JR. Sergeant

#### LAUREN ROSE Captain



Thursday was red, white, and blue day in honor of our country in this troubling time. It felt good to do that. It was also fun to wear civilians.



## Who Are The Crusaders?

The Crusader program was begun at CHA under the leadership of Commandant Shane Blanton. The purpose of the program is to challenge cadets to reach their highest potential in important areas of their lives.
