Alumni Day. While a handful of Cadets helped at Port Gibson's Heritage Festival on Saturday, 25 March, the remainder of the Cadets on campus got some visitors. This year, in addition to the Alumni assembly, lunch and campus tours, Chamberlain-Hunt offered dorm inspections to the 60-some-odd Alumni who attended.

Before lunch in the Dining Facility, Alumni observed a Pass in Review on the Parade Deck,

which was new to many of them who recalled their Pass in Reviews taking place on the front lawn of campus. Cadet officers joined the Alumni for lunch, and the other Cadets, who ate earlier, made ready for inspection. Alumni particularly enjoyed seeing their old dorm rooms and visiting with the boys who inhabit them now.

The day started with registration and refreshments at the White House, known to most Alumni as the President's House. Alumni visited with each other or with teachers on the lawn, or sat around the board table looking at old yearbooks.

At 11 o'clock, the group assembled in the auditorium where they joined the Cadet Chorus singing the *Alma Mater*, the words of which were written by Dr. Landrum Salley during his first and

only year teaching at Chamberlain-Hunt—more than 50 years ago.

Dr. Salley and his wife, who now live in Nashville, were special guests of the day. Alumnus "Wid" Himel (Class of 1954) spoke briefly about Dr. Salley and his contribution to the lives of Cadets and COL Blanton presented Dr. Salley with a framed Chamberlain-Hunt print. Teachers were reminded that though they may not immediately know their influence on Cadets, it can live on in Cadets for

years to come. Following the honoring of Dr. Salley and a song from the Chorus, Cadet T. Johnson (WA) favored the assembly with a rousing rendition of "Alexander's Ragtime Band" on the piano and Cadet D. Bogenreif (CA) wowed them with a violin piece.

Though these were difficult acts to follow, COL Blanton, MAJ Key

and LTC West rose to the occasion and reported on various aspects of life today at the Academy. MAJ Pamudji's slideshow rounded out the program.

Following the dorm inspection, Alumni loaded on the buses, which took them out to the Wilderness to see Cadets demonstrating their skills on the high ropes, the paintball arena and the pugil pit. The beautiful spring day concluded with door prizes and cold Cokes back at the White House.
