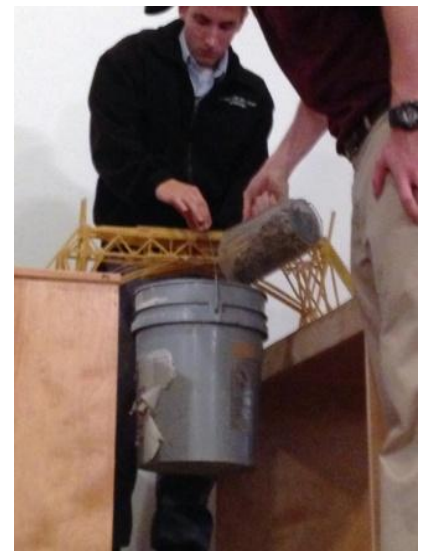
Physics Classes Build and Break Pasta Bridges

CHA Corps of Cadets Learns Military Strategies

On Saturday, the CHA Cadet Corps exercised various military tactics while the Scouts were out camping for the weekend. These tactics would be used in combat action.
