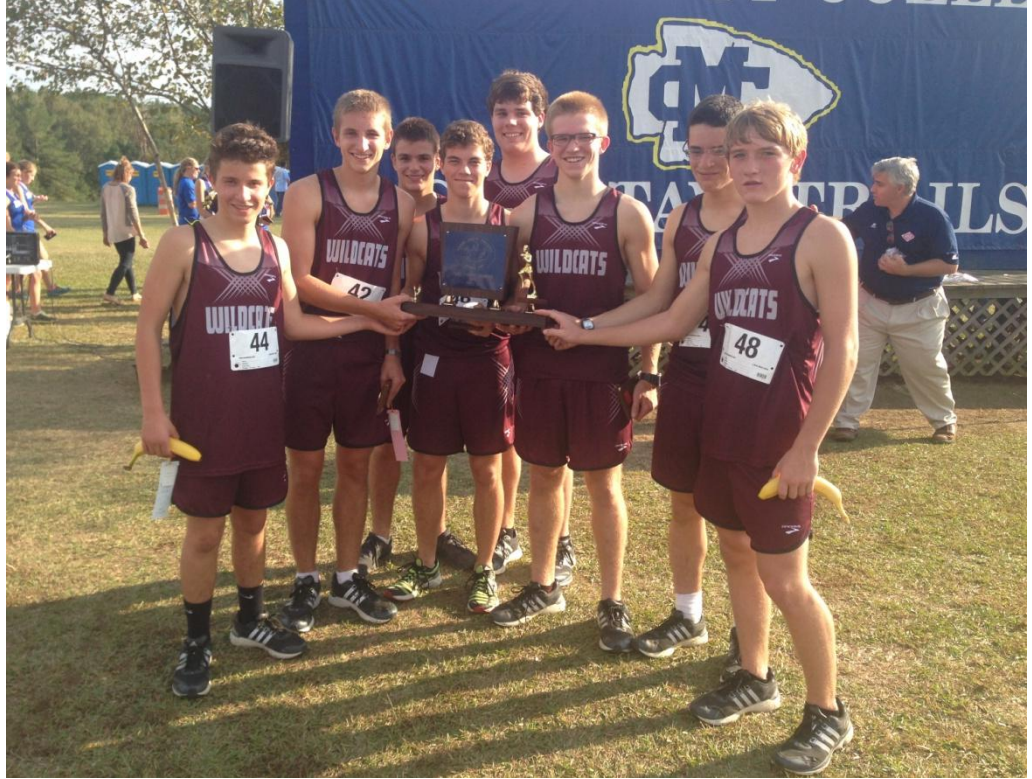

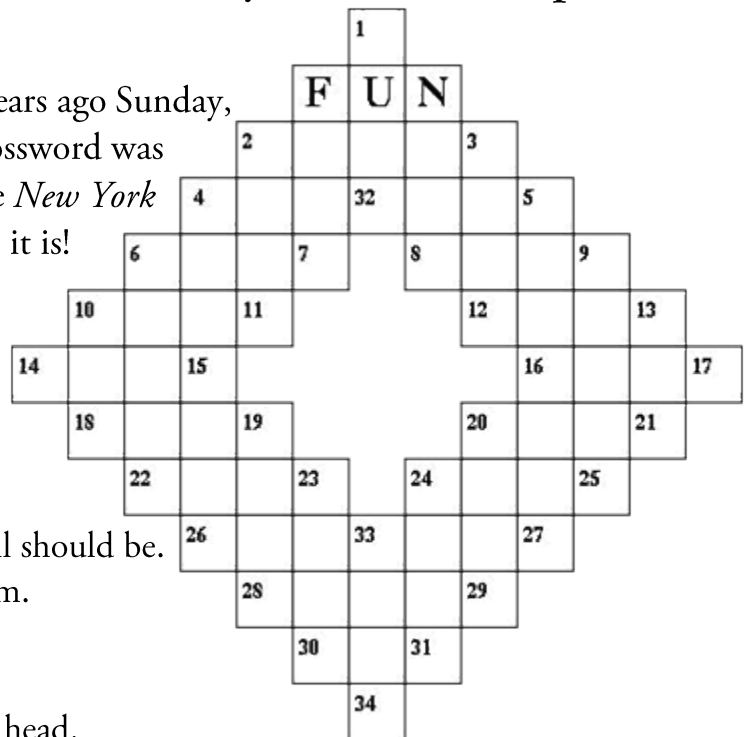

One hundred years ago Sunday, the first ever crossword was published in the *New York World*, and here it is! Enjoy!

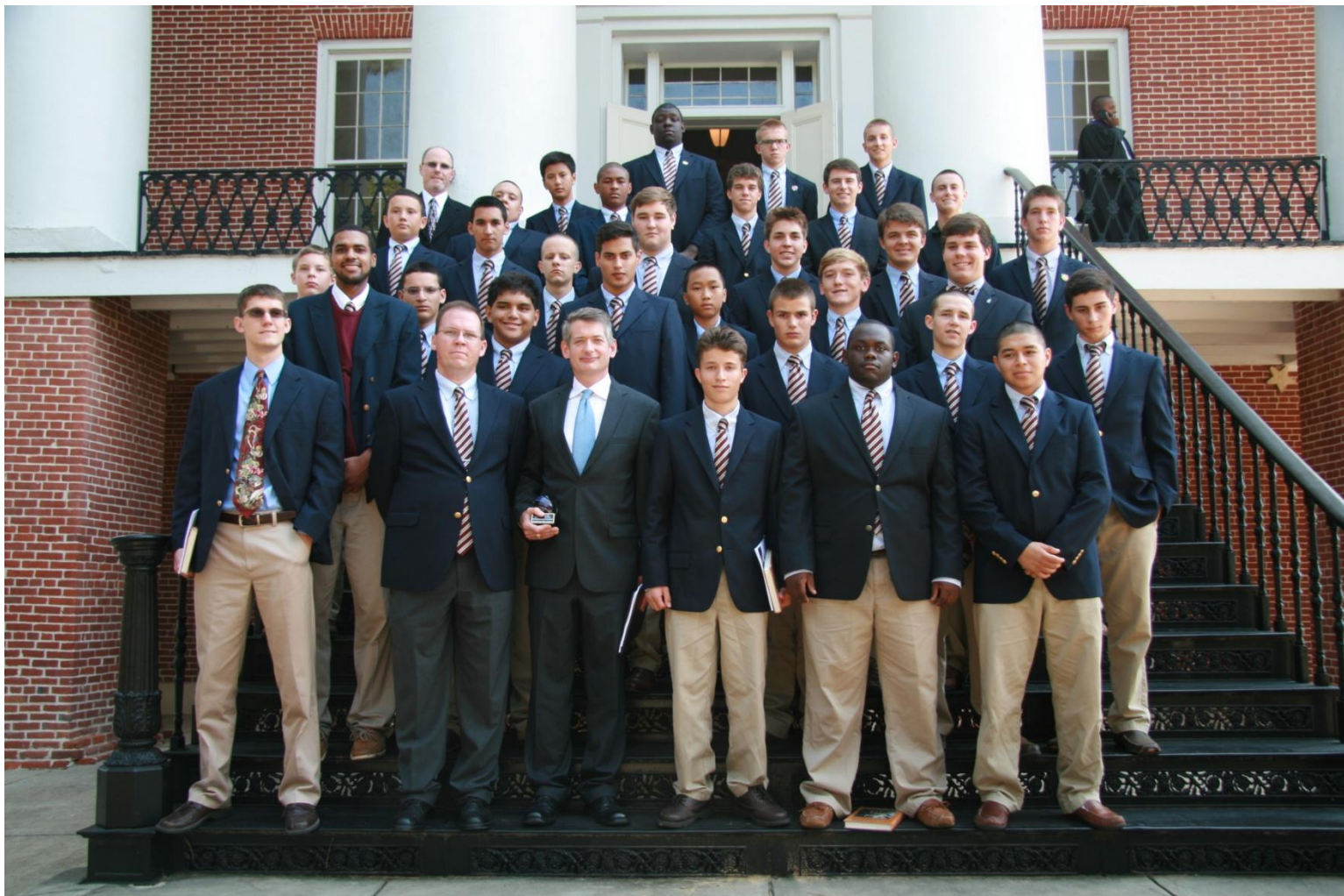
