The Preparatory Department consists, at present, of an English and Classical School; and it is in contemplation to add a School for the French and other Modern Languages.

In the English School, Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, English Grammar, and the Elements of Modern Geography are taught.

In the Classical School the Elements of the Latin and Greek Languages are taught. The Books used are as follows:

Adam's Latin Grammar; Ainsworth's Latin Dictionary; Mair's Introduction; Jacob's Latin Reader; Cæsar's Commentaries; Sallust, (by Anthon); Ovid's Metamorphoses; Cicero's Orations; Virgil; Valpy's Greek Grammar, (by Anthon); Jacob's Greek Reader; Greek Testament; Groves', Pickering's, or Donnegan's Greek Lexicon, Neilson's Greek Exercises; Tooke's Pantheon; Adam's Roman Antiquities; Lempriere's Classical Dictionary; Arithmetic, English Grammar, and Modern Geography revised.

Applicants for admission into the Freshman Class must be able to read and parse Cæsar, Virgil's Bucolics, Cicero and Jacob's Greek Reader, and shall have learned Arithmetic, English Grammar, and the Elements of Modern Geography. And all applicants for an advanced standing must be equal to the class for which they are applicants.

The studies and books used in the several classes are as follow :

FRESHMAN CLASS.

Day's Algebra; Playfair's Euclid; Virgil; Græca Majora, 1st vol.; Adam's Roman Antiquities; Cleaveland's Grecian Antiquities; English Grammar; Woodbridge's Geography, large edition.

SOPHOMORE CLASS.

Day's Algebra; Day's Mathematics, II, III, IV; vol. I Playfair's Euclid; Cicero's Orations; Horace; Homer's Iliad, (Robison's); Græca Majora, Tytler's History; Porter's Analysis; Jamieson's Rhetoric; Jewish Antiquities, (Nevin's); Constitution of the United States.

JUNIOR CLASS.

Dutton's Conic Sections and Spherical Trigonometry; Olmsted's Natural Philosophy; Horace; Quintillian; Græca Majora, 2d vol.; Blair's Rhetoric; Hedge's Logic; Chemistry; Hebrew, (Stuart's course); Paley's Natural Theology.

SENIOR CLASS.

Olmsted's Natural Philosophy; Astronomy; Chemistry; Cicero de Natura Deorum; Latina Excerpta; Græca Majora, 2d vol.; Paley's Evidences of the Christian Religion; Philosophy of the Human Mind, (Brown and Payne); Hebrew, (Stuart's Course); Moral Philosophy, (Paley and Wayland); Say's Political Economy.

A part of the Students are exercised in composition and declamation every week.

Each Student is required to have a copy of the Scriptures and to attend a recitation in the Bible Class or Sunday School, and to attend Church in the College every Sabbath.

The religious exercises in College, besides those on the Sabbath, are morning and evening prayers.

There are two examinations in the year, each continuing for three days. The first commences on the first Monday in August, and the second on the Monday before the first Thursday in April. The first Thursday in April is the day of commencement.

The College Year consists, in fact, of one session; but is divided into two terms, for the sake of convenience. The Winter Session commences on the second Monday of October, and consists of six months, and ends on the day of commencement. The Summer Session commences on the Monday after the first day of commencement, and ends on the Thursday after the first Monday in August, consisting of four months. The vacation consists of about two months, from the close of the Summer Session till the second Monday in October.

The Tuition and Board are required for each Session in advance, and if the Board be not paid in advance, the Steward is permitted to charge at the end of the Session two dollars per month in addition, for neglect of prompt payment.

For the common repairs of the College buildings the Students are charged one dollar per session.

Any Student entering at any time in the Session before it is half expired, shall pay for the whole session, but if after the half he shall pay for the half Session.

Students provide their own beds, bedding, and candles.

The College is located in Claiborne County, Mi., within five miles of the river Mississippi—Rodney being the nearest point.
