## ACT Preparation

On Friday, February 8, Cadets in grades 10 through 12 attended lectures on skills to help make ACT test taking successful. Groups were led by MAJ Strawn, MAJ Davis, MAJ McLemore and MAJ Montgomery. Each group spent one class period with each instructor focusing on the various testing topics of English, mathematics, reading and science and rotated through each class over four class periods.

The next morning, 57 Cadets traveled to Alcorn State University to take the ACT exam. This was a large increase from the 16 Cadets who took the exam in December.

Scores in December averaged 22 points, with two Cadets scoring a 27 and two scoring a 25. Three of these Cadets were juniors. The national average score for students taking the ACT in 2007 was 21.2.
