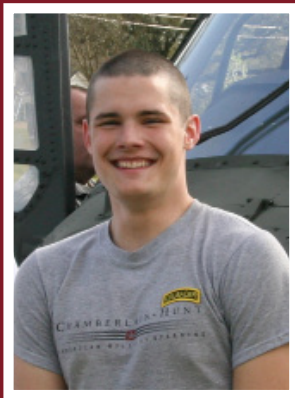

### The Black Hawk Visits Our Campus

On Saturday, 15 March, the Mississippi Army National Guard visited the campus of Chamberlain-Hunt to speak to the Cadets about opportunities offered by the Guard.

Cadets were rotated by company through each station. The first station displayed a laser tag mock insurgent compound seizure. In this simulation, Cadets worked in groups of three to overtake an enemy compound to secure the safety of a nearby town. Each group took turns helping one another find the enemies in the compound and protect one another from danger.

Next, Cadets challenged one another to rock wall races. On this 30 ft tower, they learned how to climb and how to repel back down to safety, all the while cheering each other on.

After the physical challenge from the rock wall, Cadets were free to explore the Black Hawk helicopter. They took turns sitting at the controls and playing with the dials and switches. A recruiter provided information about different career avenues offered by the Guard and about the educational benefits of joining the Guard.

Everyone, including the cadre and their families, enjoyed the beautiful spring day learning about the men and women who serve our country.
