The Veterans Day Service is Chamberlain-Hunt's opportunity to invite and recognize veterans, local and non, who have given so much of themselves in exchange for the lifestyle, freedom, and opportunity that we each share but seldom consider. Robert J. Bailey, (Army National Guard) had served our nation along side of LTC G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery, after whom is named the "Montgomery G.I. Bill." Mr. Bailey gave an address to the Cadets, honored veterans and guests wherein he explained the evolution of Veterans Day, delivered a biography of "Sonny" Montgomery.



Bailey says at the foundation, they point to six character traits that Sonny possessed. They believe every young person should aspire to the following characteristics:

Integrity---always be honest with yourself and others

Service Before Self---use your gifts to serve the needs of others

Excellence---always leave a place or organization in better condition than when you got there

Passion---believe in what you do and do it wholeheartedly

Compassion---be sensitive to the needs of others and treat them with dignity

Courage---do not shrink from facing even the most difficult of tasks"
