A Day to Honor Veterans

As is our tradition at Chamberlain-Hunt, the Cadets marched down Church Street carrying an impressive American flag. The flag, which is thirty feet long and covers nearly three traffic lanes of space, was carried proudly by about 24 Cadets. Two local police cars diverted traffic for the Cadet Corps.

The flag parade is an opportunity for the entire battalion and the community of Port Gibson to honor our nation's servicemen and women. Along the parade route, school children and residents waved flags and cheered the Cadets. Following the parade, a program was held at the First Presbyterian Church. The guests of honor were local veterans who told about their military service.

Deceased veterans were remembered as Pipe Major Staer played "Amazing Grace" on the bagpipes. MAJ Monya Williams played "Taps," and everyone joined together to sing the National Anthem. Dr. Jim Cook, LTC, gave a special address to the Cadets, honored veterans and guests. Lunch was served to everyone at the cafeteria with a patriotic flag cake for dessert.
