### Hog Wild

On Monday, Cadets from Sciences classes and MAJ Fraley's English gathered around as MAJ Dowell and Arwine skinned and dissected a hog. "The exercise we were doing would best come under the heading of 'comparative anatomy,'" says MAJ Arwine.



"I went through all 11 body systems (what we are studying now in Biology class) and discussed different organ purposes." He continues to explain, "This is why we use fetal pigs in Biology—because they are excellent subjects to compare 'our' anatomy to. Their organs are roughly in the same area and size as ours. Anatomical dummies can only do so much. Ain't nothin' like the real thing!" Following the lessons on internal organs and anatomy, MAJ Dowell discussed where we get different cuts of meat from a pig.



It was obvious that these Cadets enjoyed the literal hands-on exercise. They could, with gloves on their hands, actually handle vital organs from the hog. They will think quite differently about the wild animals that roam around. They are seeing past the blood, fat, tissue, and yes, even the gore to reveal the amazing handiwork of their Maker.
