LTC Quentin Johnston

Principal

LTC Johnston has been married to Pam, a career educator, for 31 years. Their adult son, Lewis, who is a computer program developer, lives and works in Chicago. All three were born in Edinburgh, Scotland.

After training for a specialist career as a Hospital Operating Department Assistant (US equivalent is O.R. nurse), LTC Johnston's career took a decidedly different turn when his career path was eliminated



because of policy changes, and he started a commercial pressure washing business. By the time he sold it nine years later, his company had grown to become the largest company of its type in the area, and had expanded its operations to include the cleaning of apartment buildings, commercial vehicles, and Royal Navy warships.

While working in the medical and commercial arenas, LTC Johnston was, for fifteen years, on the pastoral team of *Edinburgh City Fellowship*, and was a founding director of *The Redwoods Caring Foundation*, a charity providing accommodation and training for adults with mental handicap. In 1992, the Johnston family moved to Tampa, FL to allow him to complete his Master of Divinity degree at *Whitefield Theological Seminary*, Lakeland, Florida. Upon graduation, he was called to pastoral ministry at the *Church of Christian Liberty*, Arlington Heights, IL, where he served from 1995-2000. Concurrent with his pastoral duties, he taught high school Christian Philosophy, Speech, and English at *Christian Liberty Academy*, the 800 student K-12 school run by the church, and also completed his doctoral studies with *Whitefield Seminary*. The Johnstons returned to Florida in 2001 shortly after LTC Johnston was appointed Academic Dean of *Whitefield College*, the four-year undergraduate distance learning college associated with the seminary.

In 2004, after transferring his ordination into the PCA, LTC Johnston was appointed Assistant Minister of Teaching at *Tampa Bay Presbyterian Church*, where, on a "spare time" basis, he oversaw the teaching ministry of the church, and served on the board of *New Tampa Christian Academy* which offers K2-4 education for local children.

LTC Johnston comes to Chamberlain-Hunt Academy with a personal understanding of the challenges and struggles many of our Cadets face. Although separated by time and distance, the issues that test youth today in terms of family crises, response to authority, peer pressure, and moral choices, vary only in specifics from those he faced growing up in Scotland, and overcame solely through the merciful grace of God.
