## Cadets Play for State Title



The Chamberlain-Hunt varsity basketball team placed second in the MPSA State AA playoffs, losing to five-time state champions Brookhaven, 41-30. After placing third in the South State tournament, the Cadets received a first round bye, defeated Canton Academy in the second

round, before defeating Bowling Green in double overtime in the semi-finals. Bowling Green had defeated the Cadets a week earlier in the South State semifinal, forcing the Cadets to play Brookhaven Academy in the consolation game. The Cadets defeated Brookhaven 58-47 in that game.

"It is extremely difficult to beat Brookhaven Academy twice in one week," said LTC Dave Granville, the varsity coach. In addition, Brookhaven hosted the state tournament, increasing the difficulty through home-court advantage.

David Hahn (TX), Chamberlain-Hunt's 7-foot center, made first team All District. Hahn was voted the district regular season Most Valuable Player and made the South State All Tournament team and the State All Tournament team. Keeniel Weaver (GA) made first team All District and South State All Tournament team. Chase Deculus (LA) made second team All District and State All Tournament team. Ifeanyi Uzuegbunam (GA) made second team All District and Josh McNair (MS) made second team All District.

"This is the first time that all 5 of the starters made the first or second All District team," said Granville. "I cannot understand how Uzuegbunam did not make the South State All Tournament team. He had 16 points against Bowling Green and put back a missed free throw to send us to the final game. But, it was a great year, and a great reflection of how well every member of the team played hard and stayed together."

Other team members were Cameron Gary (LA), Jalen Ellington (GA), Neil Jordan (NY), Derrick Daughtry (FL), Josh Goodwin (TX) and Dillon Bogenrief (CA). Uzuegbunam, Weaver, Deculus, Ellington and Jordan will be back next year to form a strong nucleus for the 2009-10 team.
