MAJ Todd Patterson Assistant Commandant

MAJ Todd Patterson was born in Kansas City, MO on April 26, 1973, and soon after moved to Colorado with his family for the first five years of his life. It was there that his parents answered God's call to be missionaries in Africa. Growing up in Africa provided an opportunity that many Americans never experience. He quickly learned to adapt to a different culture and language, and at the age of 11 was enrolled in a Christian boarding school for five years.



After 10 years in Africa his parents returned to the United States and he finished high school in Ft. Collins, CO. Upon graduation in June of 1991, MAJ Patterson enlisted in the Marine Corps Reserve and after boot camp in San Diego, CA, he enrolled as a freshman at Spring Arbor University in Jackson, MI. While there he received a scholarship to play tennis and served as the team captain during his senior year and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in History in June of 1995. He also served at the local Marine Reserve unit, 4th Bridge Co, 6th Engineer Support Battalion as a Bridge Construction Crewman. During his time there, he was promoted through the rank of Sergeant.

After graduating from university, MAJ Patterson was accepted to Officer Candidate School and reported to Quantico, VA for duty. In April 1996, he was commissioned in the Marine Corps as a 2nd Lieutenant and completed follow-on training for an additional six months after which he was designated to be an Artillery Officer and reported to Ft. Sill, OK home of the Army Field Artillery Training School. Departing from Ft. Sill, MAJ Patterson began his first duty station in 29 Palms, CA at the Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center and was assigned to 3rd Battalion, 11th Marine Regiment. During his 4 years in the desert sands, he held tactical and command duties to include Battery Commander for Lima and Head Quarters Batterys. In January 2000, MAJ Patterson was promoted to Captain and assigned to Delta Co, Marine Security Guard Battalion, Ft. Lauderdale, FL. His duties included bi-monthly inspection visits to all U.S. Embassies and Consulates in Latin America with a focus on terrorism threat deterrence and life and property protection.

In October of 2002, he separated from the Marine Corps and pursued a career in the private sector in Tampa, FL. It was there in July of 2008, that he answered the call to pursue a new career at Chamberlain-Hunt Academy and is currently serving as the Assistant Commandant.

He and his wife Mandy were married in July of 2001, and they have one daughter, Gabriella, born in August of 2007.
