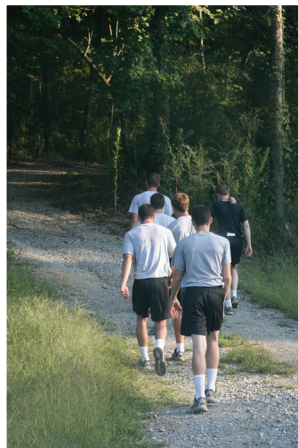
"The thing that attracted me the most about Chamberlain-Hunt was its ministry to the Cadets. This is a place where the Spirit of God moves."

Alan grew up in the coastal city of San Diego. He attended private school from an early age and was active in his church. He played water polo and swam on the swim team. The city of San Diego offered Alan a coaching position just shy of his eighteenth birthday. He accepted the offer and became a lifeguard, swim instructor and water polo coach. After high school Alan enrolled in Bannockburn College, one of two schools in the United States of a classical model. The pastor and writer, Dr. George Grant, started the college in 1997. Under Dr. Grant's tutelage, MAJ McClelland's life and thinking changed profoundly. MAJ McClelland graduated from Bannockburn in 2003 with a Bachelor of Arts in Moral Philosophy.

After college MAJ McClelland enrolled in seminary. One year into seminary he married Kristin Scherrer, an accomplished Civil War historian and graduate of Bannockburn College. They had their first son, Gilbert, nearly two years later. Working his way through seminary and becoming a husband and father was tough, but MAJ McClelland graduated from seminary in the spring of 2007 with a Master of Divinity in Missions.

MAJ McClelland and Kristin reside in Port Gibson and recently had their second son, Patrick.

"I really do consider these Cadets my mission. I am here because of them—to give them an education saturated with the gospel (knowledge) and empowered by the Holy Spirit (wisdom). That is what Chamberlain-Hunt Academy is all about."



Crusader Challenge Week, Part II

The Tactical Mission is the last stage of the Crusader Challenge. As their final mission, Cadets make a road march and defend their territory.
