Expert Cadet Badge November 1-3

Last week, all Cadets went to the Wilderness to train in small groups for testing for Expert Cadet Badge recognition. 23 completed all 10 testing stations, and the APFT, with passing marks. Included stations were rifle range, first aid, CPR, water training, individual movement, map reading, M-4 assembly and disassembly, camouflage, indirect fire, SALUTE, and hand & arm signals. After cadre examined each Cadet at all of these stations, the Cadets who passed them all faced a rigorous physical endurance test as the final hurdle to earn this coveted badge.
