Veterans' Day Observance

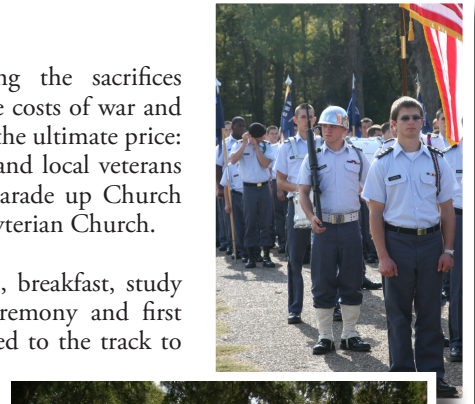
09 November 2007

Honoring veterans, remembering the sacrifices that were paid, understanding the costs of war and paying respect to those who paid the ultimate price: on 09 November, Cadets, cadre and local veterans observed Veterans' Day with a parade up Church Street and a program at the Presbyterian Church.

The morning began with reveille, breakfast, study hall, the regular flag-raising ceremony and first period class. Then Cadets marched to the track to stage the parade and unfurl the US flag. It took 31 Cadets to carry the flag! The parade up Church Street ended at the First Presbyterian Church for a program honoring US veterans—local and across the land—of all wars.

The guest speaker was COL John W. Ray. Currently president of *Ewing and Ray Foundation*

Services, Inc. in Ridgeland, Mississippi, COL Ray was commissioned as an Infantry Officer upon graduation from Officers Candidate School Class #54 on 09 December 1968. His first duty assignment was as an instructor with the Basic Combat Training Committee Group at Fort Gordon, Georgia. His last duty assignment was as US Army Emergency Liaison Preparedness Officer for Mississippi, First US Army, Fort Gillem, Georgia.



Besides COL Ray's address, each veteran at the program was recognized, the whole congregation sang "America, the Beautiful" and Cadet T. Fulton (CA) recited the WWI poem, "In Flanders Fields." The program concluded with MAJ Monya Williams' playing taps.

Afterwards, veterans and guests joined the Cadets and cadre for a lunch of lasagna and German chocolate cake. Cadets greeted guests and shook hands with the veterans attending the luncheon.
