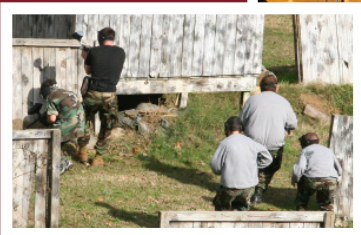

Catechism Question and Bible Verse memory work for the Week of December 10

Q57. Which is the fourth commandment?

A. The fourth commandment is, Remember the Sabbath-day to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy man-servant, nor thy maid-servant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates. For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath-day, and hallowed it. (Exodus 20:8-11)

CSM Tierney

Born and reared in Rhode Island, Command Sergeant Major Ed Tierney comes from a long line of military tradition. His great grandfather served in WWI, and his grandfather was a career soldier who served in WWII and was among the many great men who stormed the beaches of Normandy on D-Day. His father served several tours in Vietnam and was severely wounded.



CSM Tierney followed the family's military tradition by joining the US Army immediately following an early graduation from high school in 1983. Tierney served with several elite units, including 2nd Ranger Battalion, and several units of the US Army Special Forces before retiring while serving with the 19th Special Forces Group. Tierney served through tours in Operation Urgent Fury (Grenada), Operation Just Cause (Panama), Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm (Kuwait and Iraq), as well as several overseas tours in Korea, Central America and the current war on terrorism.

CSM Tierney and his wife, Lori, have five children. The three oldest are carrying on the family's military tradition. SGT Kevin Tierney is attached to 1st Special Operations Command and is currently in the US Army Defense Language Institute in California learning Farsi. He was previously stationed in the 3rd Infantry (The Old Guard), guarding the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, and was stationed at the Pentagon on 11 September 2001. Their second son, SGT Christopher Tierney is an Airborne Ranger with 3rd Ranger Battalion. He served two combat tours in Iraq and, like his father and grandfather before him, earned a Purple Heart for injuries he received in combat. The youngest of the three boys, LCPL Douglas Tierney, recently joined the Marines and serves as an Explosives Ordnance Technician with the 2nd Marine Expeditionary Force. The couple's youngest children are two girls, still living at home. Rachael, 11, is a sixth grader at Claiborne Education Foundation. Kimberly is 8, and due to complications at birth, she is now blind and has cerebral palsy.

Reporting to the commandant, CSM Tierney supervises the TAC officers and Cadets and is the chief instructor in military skills, tactics and operations. He plays a key role in orchestrating Crusader Challenge, ECB, CALFEX and Green Cycle. "Green Cycle" is an opportunity to train Cadets to be strong, prepared and attentive to details. Approximately 10 Cadets at a time train in various military tactics, processes or procedures. This week Cadets will train on the high- and low-ropes courses. Previously they learned to disassemble and reassemble M4s, and to shoot. These activities take place in the Wilderness area during afternoon activities.
