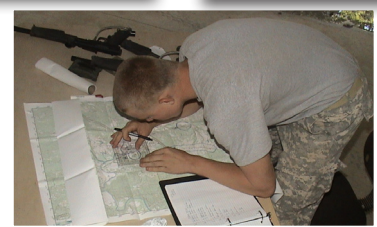
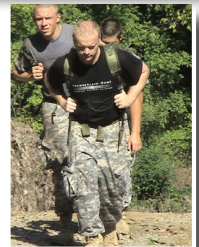
Crusader Challenge

Designed after the Army Rangers' Training, the Crusader Challenge is the most difficult of a Cadet's aspirations while attending Chamberlain-Hunt. Contenders must successfully complete four and a half days of physical, mental, emotional and psychological training. First, they must stand at attention for two hours. Then they must pass the PFT: running two miles in fourteen minutes and thirty seconds, doing fifty-two push-ups under two minutes and completing sixty-two sit-ups in under two minutes.



During the rest of the week the Cadets trained in land navigation, dig fox holes and run through a confidence course. They also learned how to dismantle and reassemble a rifle in under two minutes. Contenders will be tested on the parts of a rifle. They did all of this with only water to drink and one hour or so of sleep at night.

There were seventeen Cadets who tried out for Crusader Challenge. Two Cadets successfully completed the challenge. A congratulation goes out to Crusader Wilcox and Crusader Wharton!
